The award is the most prestigious award given by the organization. This award is bestowed upon long-time members with dedication to the high ideals of the MEHA and its mission. The recipient's accomplishments reflect his or her unselfish dedication and service to the field of Public Health and the goals of the Missouri Environmental Health Association. Nominations for the Lifetime Achievement Award are made solely by the Executive Board members, although suggestions from the membership will be considered.</p>
<p>Dan Mittleberg</p>	<p><b>Wilbur S. Feagan Award</b>          The Wilbur S. Feagan Award was first awarded in 1992. Mr. Wilbur S. Feagan, a former member of our association and now currently the owner of F &amp; H Food Equipment Company in Springfield, Missouri wanted to recognize the front line sanitarians in the cities, counties, and state that carry out the day to day duties of environmental health, education and disease prevention. He requested only three criteria for this award. They are as follows:          1. The recipient must be a current member of the Missouri Environmental Health Association.          2. The recipient must spend at least 50% of his or her time in field activities.          3. The recipient must show outstanding efforts.          The award comes with a \$600.00 honorarium and plaque.</p>
<p>Kristen Geary</p>	<p><b>ENVIRONMENTAL PUBLIC HEALTH SPECIALIST OF THE YEAR AWARD</b>          This award is given for significant contributions in the field. These contributions involve but may not be limited to the following areas:          1. Noteworthy professional accomplishments involving the candidate's job-related achievements, leadership, contributions to programs and program effectiveness. The nominator should explain how these achievements have contributed to the health and welfare of citizens.          2. Professional organizational activities involving offices held, committee assignments and activities related to environmental organizations at all levels, local to international.          3. Continuing education, demonstrating that the nominee has kept current and how he or she has contributed to the education of others.          4. Personal attributes, indicating that the nominee has</p>

	<p>demonstrated abilities, character, judgement, efficient use of time, management skills, etc., that may bear significantly on the qualifications for the award.</p> <p>5. Community service activities, explaining how the nominee has served his or her local areas in civic and social activities.</p>
Lori Murray	<p><b>ROOKIE OF THE YEAR AWARD</b></p> <p>This award recognizes individuals that have exhibited exemplary behavior and have contributed in an outstanding way to the field of environmental health.</p> <p>Qualifications:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Nominees must be within the first five years of employment in the field.</li> <li>2. A strong commitment to the ideals and programs relating to environmental public health issues.</li> <li>3. Possess a high level of motivation and willingness to accept new challenges.</li> </ol>
Barb Samson	<p><b>SPECIAL RECOGNITION AWARD</b></p> <p>This award has been created to recognize special contributions to the environmental, public health and protection field. Qualifications:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Membership in the Missouri Association is not a prerequisite of eligibility.</li> <li>2. A candidate shall have made a significant contribution in the field of food or environmental protection in the state of Missouri.</li> <li>3. The award may be made to co-workers if they have contributed equally to the work for which the nomination is made.</li> <li>4. Members of the Executive Board are not eligible for this award.</li> </ol>
Kristen Geary	<p><b>PRESIDENT'S AWARD</b></p> <p>The President's Award was first awarded in 1997 and is designed to honor those members of the Association who have made significant contributions to the Association or the Executive Board. Nominations come from the Executive Board members themselves, although suggestions from association members will be considered. The Executive Board members determine the number of awards to be given each year. Criteria for the Award are as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. EDMONDSON SCHOLARSHIP</b></p> <p>A scholarship of \$500.00 is awarded to an upper-class undergraduate student with at least a 2.8 out of a 4.0 GPA or a graduate student with a GPA of 3.25 out of 4.0 or above. The student must be majoring in a field related to milk, food or environmental sanitation. The basis of the</p>
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	award should include good moral character, financial need and activities as well as academic performance. The scholarship committee of the Department of Food Science and Nutrition at the University of Missouri-Columbia is responsible for obtaining applications from eligible students and shall screen the applications to find up to five of the most highly qualified.
Hannah Morrison	<p><b>Hainline Heritage Foundation Scholarship</b></p> <p>The foundation presents an annual scholarship award to an Environmental Public Health undergraduate student. It was the desire of Joe Hainline, the founder of our Foundation, to assist a worthy student who aspired to have a career in Environmental Health. Joe was a valued member of the Missouri Milk, Food, and Environmental Health Association (MMFEHA) and hoped that such a scholarship could be awarded through this organization. MEHA (formally MMFEHA) has annually allowed us to present the HHCF Scholarship at their spring Awards Banquet to a student who is selected by the Missouri Southern State University (MSSU) Scholarship Selection Committee.</p>
